I want to inform you that we have received an offer to buy our lodge building from Brother Neal Turner of Daylight Masonic Lodge #1443 in the amount of Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000). The sale of the building would be "as is" in its current condition, and the lodge will make no repairs or improvements or give the buyer any credits to do so. A resolution stating this will be presented at our next stated meeting, Friday, March 8, 2019. The meeting will begin at 7:30pm. This will be a first reading of the resolution with discussions being allowed after. A second reading and vote will be taken at the next stated meet-

THE BIOLOGY OF MASONRY BY DAVID LANG

In his book The Biology of Belief Dr. Bruce Lipton speaks about the effects of our thoughts on every cell of our body. This very real link between our thoughts and our biology is demonstrated again and again in Masonry. Masonry is a family of like-minded individuals who have agreed

The secrets of masonry are not passed in a word or a handshake, the secrets are passed from heart to heart in vibration that no words can express. It's not magic, it's not witchcraft, it's a call to remember who you really are and why you have come to this amazing place to expand and create.






WORHIPFUL MASTER JUSTIN ROBBINS From the East





INTERPRETATION OF THE RITUAL OF THE THIRD DEGREE

Part 1 of 4

The Sublime Degree of Master Mason. It is indeed a "sublime" Degree, one to which a man might devote his whole time in study for years to come without exhausting it. Undoubtedly you realized this yourself as you participated in its mysteries, so that you may now appreciate a hint as to its meaning.

Almost any interpretation of it,

especially one so brief as this, must necessarily be a hint only, and that for the sake of stimulating a man to reflect upon it for himself and to study it more thoroughly in the future.

In the First and Second Degrees you found yourself surrounded by the symbols and emblems of architecture; in the Third Degree you found yourself in a different order of symbolism, one cast in the language of the soul—its life, its tragedy and its triumph. To recognize this fact is the first step in interpretation.
