

#### **GRAND MASTER'S PROCLAMATION**

Today I spoke with Gardner Pate, Deputy Chief of Staff for Governor Greg Abbott, concerning Executive Orders GA 30 and GA 31 issued today as well as the mandates presently in place to combat the COVID-19 pandemic. According to Mr. Pate, and of importance to Texas Masonic Lodges, meetings of groups of 75% of the capacity of a building can be held indoors if masks are worn within 6 feet each another. A discussion was had which generally described the above requirements in context with the conferral of Masonic degrees. It was the decision of Mr. Pate, based upon the limited information provided to him, that conferral of Masonic degrees could now resume and would not violate any of the current mandates. Based upon the above, it is my PROCLAMATION that Texas Lodges may immediately commence the conferral of Masonic degrees and proficiency examinations, with the following caveat or warning. Lodges are instructed to be extremely careful of the age, health and physical condition of candidates before conferrals. The candidate should be advised generally that certain appropriate touching will take place during the conferral and the decision to submit to the degree ceremonies should be that candidate's sole decision. Everyone must wear masks and hand sanitizers must be readily available throughout the Lodge and Lodge room where there is physical contact, particularly handshakes. In addition to the Governor's mandates, all County and City requirements must also be followed. It is the decision of each individual Lodge when they resume degree work. All prior Grand Master's Proclamations, Edicts or Messages are amended, superseded or clarified as follows:

- 1. Supersedes my Proclamation dated March 21, 2020 regarding cancelling all stated and called meetings;
- 2. Supersedes my Proclamation dated April 29, 2020 regarding reopening of Lodges;
- 3. Keeps in effect my Message dated June 16, 2020 regarding serving of meals and compliance with State and local guidelines for restaurants.
- 4. Clarifies my Proclamation dated July 3, 2020 regarding the wearing of masks;
- 5. Amends my Message dated July 10, 2020 regarding meetings;
- 6. Supersedes my Proclamation dated August 25, 2020 regarding study gro








The right to travel according to masonic law. A Mason desiring to visit another lodge within the jurisdiction of his Grand Lodge has only to present a current dues card and a valid ID to gain entry, however, if the mason in question has never sat in open lodge with any of the brethren present the visiting brother should be prepared in the event that he is "tried" by familiarizing himself with the Tyler's Oath and to a lesser extent the various grips, words, questions and answers of the three degrees. If a mason desires to attend a lodge outside of his Grand Lodge jurisdiction, he should check to make sure the lodge in question is a regular masonic lodge in "Fraternal Relations" with his Grand Lodge by referencing a book titled "List of Regular Lodges Masonic". He should then inform the secretary of his lodge of the date he intends to visit. The secretary will inform his Grand Lodge. The Grand

Lodge of his jurisdiction will communicate with the Grand Lodge the brother intends to visit. A mason is not permitted to communicate with a Grand Lodge outside his jurisdiction. The brother will then receive paperwork signed by the secretary of his lodge that the brother will present when he visits. The visiting brother should then check with a member of the lodge he intends to visit to find out about any etiquette or dress code the brother will be expected to adhere to. It is advised that you begin this process well in advance of when you intend to visit.


#### FROM THE OUTGOING WORSHIPFUL MASTER HEATH MORGAN

# The Quarry: Our Esoteric Work By Bro. Coke Etgen, PM

Gädieke says that, "according to the ancient laws of Freemasonry, every brother must attend his Lodge if he is within the length of his cable tow." The old writers define the length of a cable tow, which they sometimes called a cable's length, to be three miles for an Entered Apprentice. But the expression is really symbolic, and as it was defined by the Baltimore Convention in 1842, means the scope of a man's reasonable ability.

The Cable Tow is thus a symbol of the cord of bond of Love, which should unite the whole fraternity. Its length or the length of your Cable Tow is the sacrifice you are willing to make on behalf of your brethren. It is in your heart, not to be measured by miles. It is not gauged by distances, but by deed. It should correspond to the immensity of the monitorial lodge, and to do so should span the earth, touching wherever there is sorrow or distress.
